

## 4 Star Charity Rating

The IRSF will operate in accordance with those generally accepted principles necessary to obtain a 4-star Charity Navigator rating.

This means that IRSF will be rated on the following criteria:

### ORGANIZATIONAL EFFICIENCY

- Performance Expenses
- Administrative Expenses
- Fundraising Expenses
- Fundraising Efficiency

### ORGANIZATIONAL CAPACITY

- Primary Revenue Growth
- Program Expenses Growth
- Working Capital Ratio

They also look at the following considerations in their evaluation process:

- Donor Privacy Policy
- CEO Pay
- Income Statements
- Mission
- Online Donations

Based on these criteria Charity Navigator gives a star rating to each charity. The 4-star rating is the most difficult to achieve.

Charity Navigator's methodology:
