Whereas Rett syndrome is a devastating neurological disorder caused by a sporadic, genetic mutation of the MECP2 gene on the X chromosome and mainly affects females; and

Whereas Rett syndrome strikes all racial and ethnic groups, and occurs worldwide in 1 of every 10,000 female births and rarer in males; and

Whereas Rett syndrome affects every aspect of life: communication, learning, movement, hand use, eating, cardiac function, digestion and breathing; and

Whereas Dedicated scientists and researchers from around the world are working to find treatments and a cure for Rett syndrome, and increased awareness of Rett syndrome is essential to provide necessary funding for this research; and

Whereas It is vital to bring Rett syndrome awareness to the medical community, teachers, therapists, caregivers and the general public so that those suffering from Rett syndrome receive the highest quality care,

Now, Therefore, I, Charles D. Baker, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim the month of October 2017, to be,

RETT SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH

And urge all the citizens of the Commonwealth to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
