Proclamation

Whereas, Rett syndrome is a genetic neurological disorder that occurs almost exclusively in females; and

Whereas, every two hours a girl is born with Rett syndrome, but symptoms usually do not appear until 6 to 18 months after birth; and

Whereas, a regression period may lead to lifelong impairments, with multiple dysfunctions: speech is lost, seizures can develop, and scoliosis occurs; many develop irregular breathing patterns, and more than half lose their ability to walk; and

Whereas, biomedical research is proving that neurological symptoms could be reversed, even after decades of severe symptoms; and

Whereas, it is important to increase awareness in the medical community among therapists, teachers, caregivers and the general public; and

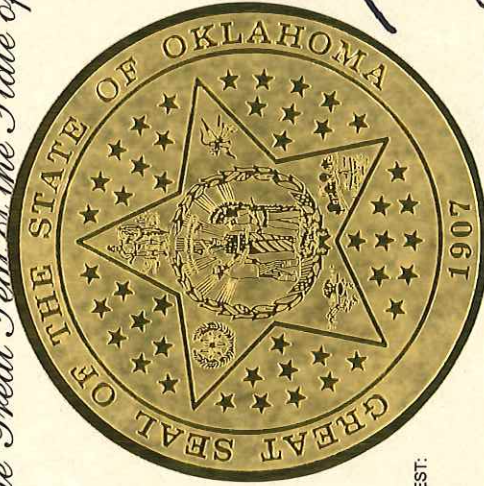
Whereas, funding is needed for research dedicated to improving the quality of life of Rett Syndrome patients and finding a cure;
